

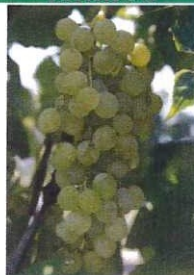
Table Grapes & Raisins

Display Trials

at Wisconsin Agricultural Research Stations

Both seeded and seedless table grapes have outstanding potential to be developed for fresh market and processing (i.e. raisins) in the state of Wisconsin. Both the West Madison (WMARS) and Peninsular Agricultural Research Stations (PARS) have table grapes on display to test for cold and drought tolerance, fruit production, and unique flavor and fruit characteristics. A part of this program involves outreach through vineyard walks, talks, taste tests, and exploring raisin production. A list of *current 2015 seedless cultivars* at WMARS and their basic information are listed in this pamphlet.

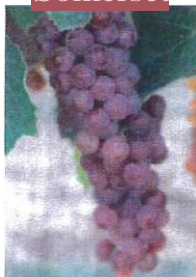

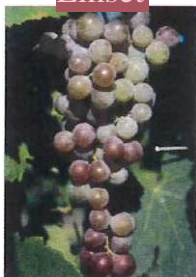

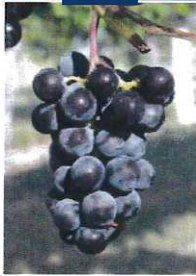
